Once before I reminded all church key holders about keeping our church locked when no one is in the building. It has also been stressed to keep it locked during night meetings after everyone has arrived. Recently on a Friday morning, the front door was found unlocked. To protect Karen or any other female that enters the building alone, it MUST be locked by the last person that leaves! Several times since my last reminder, the building has not been- locked.

Due to the many church break-ins recently in the community we have to keep it locked. Anyone can unlock the front door and lock it while it is open, then close it OR lock it when you leave.

If the church continues to be left unlocked, the Board of Trustees will consider having only six or seven keys available to the church. If you do not have a key, you will have to make arrangements with one of those-people to gain access into the church or wait until one of them is at the church. -I do not want to pursue this action but this church will be secure.

Remember, if you UNLOCK it; make sure it is LOCKED when the last person leaves. Thank you for your cooperation.

Pill Container Program Reaches Unimaginable Height A Mountain of Pill Containers

Austin, Texas ... "It seems like such a simple thing; a small plastic prescription container. We all have them and we all pretty well take them for granted," observes Bryon Bhagwandin, President of the Malawi Project. "This is not the case in most impoverished nations especially nations like Malawi where income in the villages is little more than \$100.00 a year. Here even a simple pill container is a cost neither the government can afford, nor the patient access. For thousands that is changing with the success of the Project's Pill Container Collection Program."

Between March 2015 and the present the outpouring of support from across North America and beyond has resulted in a million prescription containers being collected and sent to Malawi. With the collection overflowing the Project's warehouse capacity and the cost of approximately \$15,000.00 that involved in getting each 40-foot container of vials to Malawi the Board of Directors has signaled the conclusion of this program as a gigantic, unexpected, unimaginable success.

A quick note of thanks to the elf that helps proofread the Beacon every month and to the elves that help throughout the year with folding and labeling!


